

ALIISA/ ALL IN - INTERNATIONAL INCLUSIVE SOCIETY IN ARTS

The international Erasmus+ Project, which runs from September 2020 to August 2023 and in which mdw is participating with Institute 12, the IMP, in collaboration with universities from Lithuania and Finland as well as inclusive conservatories and music and dance schools, will celebrate its Multiplier Event with a symposium on June 12, 2023.

The focus of this project - as stipulated by the UNESCO Sustainable Development Goals – is working towards contemporary affirmative attitudes towards inclusive music and arts education, creating open access to the arts and equity of participation regarding cultural activities in different contexts. A continuing education course for students at master's level over two semesters was developed as a pilot: ALIISA Continuing Inclusive Art Education (ACIAE), to be implemented at European universities.

In the morning, after a brief overview of the work results of the Lithuanian, Finnish and Austrian editions, there will be a round table discussion with the historian and philosopher Dr. Philipp Blom as well as teachers and students on the topic Music as Social Hope. In the afternoon, ALIISA-like interprofessional cooperation between students of instrumental pedagogy and students of art and cultural pedagogy from the Institute for Artistic Teaching at the Academy of Fine Arts will demonstrate their collaboration in the context of a performance by the mdw ensemble ClassicAll, which makes music inclusively. Afterwards, the results of the syllabus group of the curriculum will be presented, combined with a performance and workshop by dancers and Dance Assists of the educational and cultural association Ich bin O.K. The symposium will be rounded off by the presentation of the results of a study on changes in teachers' competences and attitudes within the project.
